  - If you have your vaccine records, please bring them, but they are not required. It's safe to revaccinate.
  - Parents/guardians will need to sign consent forms, which will be available at the event.
  - The vaccines are available for any children ages 4-18 (the children do not need to attend Issaquah School District).
